


## 4-H BARREL RACING





## **Texas Barrels**

Three barrels placed in a triangular formation. For the 80' course, which can be used in all 3 states, Nos. 1 and 2 barrels are set 33' from the start–finish line and 60' apart. No. 3 barrel is 80' from the Nos. 1 and 2 barrels. For the 75' course, used in Washington only, the Nos. 1 and 2 barrels are set 30' from the start–finish line and 75' apart. The No. 3 barrel is 75' from the Nos. 1 and 2 barrels. Both courses use a 60' start line.

The rider crosses the starting line, circles the No. 1 barrel to the right, crosses to the No. 2 barrel, circles it to the left, rides to the No. 3 barrel, circles it to the left, and travels across the finish line. The rider may alternatively cross the starting line to the No. 2 barrel, circle it to the left, cross to the No. 1 barrel, circle it to the right, run to the No. 3 barrel, circle it to the right, and proceed across the finish line.
