### **Come and Shoot: Archery, Shotgun, Pellet Rifle, Pellet Pistol & Pistol**

This is a round robin Jamboree; all participants will rotate to each 4-H shooting discipline. Firearms will be provided for each discipline, excluding .22 pistol. You must bring your own ammunition, except arrows.

Open to 4-H members and non-members. Non-members are required to enroll in 4-H by Friday, May 5 to shoot at this event, **parent's signature required at Jamboree.**

Jamboree is the best and most convenient opportunity to obtain your shooting sports safety member card.

To compete in 4-H Shooting Sports classes for the Ferry County Fair you must be 4-H enrolled in your chosen Shooting Sports discipline(s), i.e. pellet pistol, archery, etc. by June 1, and have a signed Shooting Sports member card. Contact the 4-H office to confirm your enrollment, learn how to attain a Shooting Sports member card if unable to attend Jamboree or for more information on the Shooting Sports Jamboree.
