May 23, 2016 4-H Leaders' Council Meeting - One Week Early

The next Klickitat County 4-H Leaders' Council meeting will be Monday, May 23, 2016 in the 4-H room at the Klickitat County Fairgrounds in Goldendale. **The May meeting is held a week earlier in May due to the Memorial Day holiday on May 30.** The leader training session begins at 6:30 pm. The council meeting begins at 7pm.

The 30 minute training session prior to each meeting is a great opportunity for enrolled 4-H leaders to obtain the six (6) hours of leader education required for every leader each 4-H year.

Remember, leaders, parents and youth who attend these meetings help determine the direction of our county program. These meetings are where the "business" of our county 4-H program is conducted. Please attend as many meetings as you can. 4-H clubs are encouraged to have a club representative regularly attend meetings.

2016 Sheep/Goat Pre-show / Weigh-in Dates

The Sheep and Goat pre-show / weigh-in will be held on Sunday, June 12 from 3pm to 6pm and an additional time slot on Monday, June 13 from 6pm to 7pm at the Klickitat County Fairgrounds. Shearing for lambs will only be available on Sunday, June 12.

4-H members must be properly enrolled in the project prior to the weigh-in. Call the Extension office you have any questions.

Be sure to have your completed "2016 Official Market Livestock Pre-Show Entry Form" correctly filled out for each animal being weighed. The form also has the minimum and maximum weights information for the large animal species. 4-H Youth Summer Horse Camp, July 10-13, 2016

The 2016 Klickitat County 4-H Youth Horse Camp is coming! It is open to all youth (with their horse) who are in grades 3 through 12 (school year just completed).

The purpose of the Horse Camp is to prepare youth for showing in their county and state 4-H fairs or just improve their horsemanship skills. Riders will have showmanship and three riding classes each day for \$150. Registrations postmarked by June 21 will also receive a 2016 4-H Youth Horse Camp T-shirt. Check-in is Sunday evening, July 10, from 5pm to 7pm; dinner will be served at 6pm.

Shavings are NOT included – you must provide your own.

PLEASE NOTE---The hours of 4-H supervision will be 6am to 8pm each day--all riders must have a designated on-site responsible adult overseeing them during the day and especially at night. Gardener Mentoring Program "GROW For It!!"

Program specifications:

 The main focus of this program is for youth to participate in learning to grow and market their produce at the Goldendale Farmers' Market,



- Through this mentoring program, participants can learn from our local experienced gardeners, produce growers and horticulturists via "their hands in the dirt" methods. Grow for family, friends and community.
- Learn the ropes to become a produce vendor at our local Farmers' Market.
- Open to youth in grades K-12, 5-18 years old, and adults
- All participants (youth and adults) will enroll in Klickitat County 4-H Program and pay \$1 for 4-H insurance annual coverage.
- Youth participation ages: Membership in 4-H is open to youth in kindergarten who have reached their 5th birthday by Dec. 31, 2015 through those youth in the 12th grade or who have not reached their 19th birthday by Dec. 31, 2015 for this current 4-H year.
- The main focus of this program is for youth. The role of adults in this program is that of a mentor for youth while they are also learning as an adult mentee with gardening.
- Adult participants must complete the 4-H volunteer application and training process which includes screening, completing online training elements and attending face-to-face mentor training (6 hour course).
- 4-H teaches life skills that lead young people to become self-directing, positive, contributing members of our society. These skills give young people the tools necessary for successful adulthood.

Program #1 Lefever Holbrook Ranch – Paulette Lefever Holbrook: Learning simple gardening skills of planning, planting, and caring of a garden. Growing your soils to produce the garden you want! Grow- harvest –Learn to sell at the Goldendale Farmers' Market. ***Planting space available for participants.

Program #2 Broken Boulder Farm - Rody and Mark Schilling: Work directly in gardens, hoophouses and at the Goldendale Farmers' Market. Participate in meaningful work by developing entrepreneurship opportunities, pre and post harvesting, direct selling of raised garden products.

Program #3: Karyn Hart: Make magic! Create an edible fairy garden at the Goldendale Farmers' Market. Artist / gardener Karyn Hart will show you how using oven bake clay, edible plants, and easy to find materials.
