Enrollment Packets for the 2014-2015 4-H Year

It's a new 4-H year! Enrollment packets for 4-H clubs can be picked up by the main club leader at the November 1 Planning Day event or at the Extension office after that date. Included in packets is *Form C1000, A Valuable Partnership*, for each enrolled leader to sign and return, and copies of the Klickitat County 4-H Volunteer Hours log / worksheet. Use this log / worksheet to report your 4-H volunteer hours and any 4-H leader training hours for the past 4-H year and then begin keeping a current log sheet. These volunteer hour logs should be turned in on a monthly basis to the Extension office to meet WSU reporting deadlines.

Re-enrollments with insurance money, club financial summaries and other forms (C1000 for each leader and volunteer hours worksheets for each leader for the past 4-H year) are due to the Extension office by December 1, 2014.

An important reminder for club leaders: the Extension office needs to be notified ahead of time regarding any fundraising activities by 4-H clubs during the year to ensure proper use of the 4-H name and logo and that appropriate guidelines are followed. We are looking forward to another great year!

WSU Releases Online Food Preservation Course

Preserve the Taste of Summer is a series of eight online lessons for consumers who want to learn about food preservation and food safety as well as those who want to update their knowledge and skills.

Provided by WSU, the lessons cover the most current USDA approved food preservation recommendations. Topics include food safety, the basics of canning (pressure and boiling water), freezing, drying, as well as making fruit spreads and pickled foods. A certificate of completion is provided at the end of the course.

The cost for the series is \$25. 4-H Volunteer Leader Requirements for Klickitat County

Volunteers are the heart of 4-H! You make all the difference in the world. Whether you want to be a club leader or work with youth on a short-term project, there's a role for you in 4-H.

The goal of 4-H is to help youth develop critical life skills as individuals and as responsible, productive citizens in their communities. Adult volunteers who spend time with 4-H youth are key in this process. They form the foundation on which productive citizens are made.

How to become a 4-H volunteer:

- 1. Klickitat County WSU Extension requires all individuals to complete a Volunteer Application.
- 2. Be screened and interviewed through the Extension Office before becoming a 4-H volunteer (leader). A part of the screening process is a criminal history check by the Washington State Patrol prior to becoming a volunteer leader.
- 3. All 4-H volunteers are required to read and sign a 4-H Volunteer Agreement form that outlines a code of conduct.
- 4. New leaders and volunteers must also participate in at least 6 hours of training provided by the Klickitat County Extension Office.
- 5. Fill out an enrollment form for the current 4-H year and pay the annual insurance fee of \$1 or \$2 (horse project).
- The Klickitat County 4-H Program requires volunteers to receive six hours of additional training each year. Volunteers submit a training log with their re-enrollments each year. Training options are shared at New Leader Training and through the Focus newsletter.

As part of new volunteer training:

- Individuals learn how to recognize and properly respond to suspected <u>CHILD ABUSE</u> and neglect.
- The training will also help to clarify what WSU 4-H expects of its volunteers and the many <u>RESOURCES</u> available to volunteers through their local Extension Office and the State 4-H Office.
- The ultimate goal is to provide a safe environment for all children through **RISK MANAGEMENT TRAINING.**
- Provide a positive learning experience for both 4-H members by learning about the <u>AGES</u> <u>AND STAGES OF YOUTH DEVELOPMENT.</u>
- Understanding <u>"WHAT IS 4-H".</u>
- The use of **4-H NAME AND EMBLEM**.
- How to handle **CLUB FINANCES**.

Following these requirements protects youth by providing them a safe environment and protecting leaders through WSU liability insurance.

All **direct** volunteers must have a background check!

A direct volunteer is anyone that has contact with youth.

* Main Club leaders are responsible for informing new club volunteers about requirements for volunteering.

An **indirect** volunteer might be a person that is on a board, a resource person, on a committee or doing a one hour program with supervision from another screened volunteer. It is prudent to do a background check on indirect volunteers if there will be an occasion for them to be alone with children at any time.

WA State 4-H Volunteer Hours Reporting

A review of information and training about the WSU Volunteer Hours Reporting database will be presented at the November 1 Planning Day event. Because enrolled 4-H volunteers are eligible for L&I coverage, Washington State Department of Labor & Industries now requires WSU to ensure that volunteers are indeed working on behalf of the University. A 4-H Volunteer Hours Reporting System information page has been set up at: http://4h.wsu.edu/volntr/reporthours.html.

Reporting your volunteer hours makes you eligible for L & I coverage for any potential injuries you might sustain in your role as a 4-H volunteer. Additionally, the total number of reported hours for each county will be made available to State and local 4-H programs to use in grant applications and information to legislators about the value of 4-H volunteer commitment.

The Volunteer Hours Reporting System is an on-line database and the preferred method for 4-H volunteers to record their 4-H volunteer hours. However, we understand that many people in Klickitat County do not have access to high-speed internet service, so alternative reporting options are available including a paper-based worksheet. This worksheet can be filled out and turned into your county Extension office. Volunteers can enter their data on-line at the Extension office as well.

If you are an enrolled Klickitat County 4-H volunteer and wish to enter your volunteer hours online but have not received an Hours Reporting user name and password, contact Lisa Harness at 509-773-5817. This reporting system for volunteer hours went into effect on October 1, 2009. Thank for your participation and understanding!

E-Learning for 4-H Volunteers on State 4-H Website

E-Learning for 4-H Volunteers is basic information about 4-H, how to get started as a leader, learning about positive youth development, leadership and teaching. Each module will take about 20 minutes. A high-speed internet connection is best; on dial-up, it will just take several minutes for the modules to download. You can do all 4 modules at once or do them individually. The modules are always available for review, too.

After completing a 10 question review at the end of each module, you can print out a Certificate of Completion. When participants click on Submit, a message will go to the State 4-H Office. County 4-H offices will be notified when an individual has completed each module. This site is available 24/7: to get started, go to http://4h.wsu.edu/volntr/elearning.htm. This is an excellent source of information about 4-H for all leaders, parents and even members!
