Go to <u>wa.4honline.com</u> Also, if you chose to pay by check, it needs to be brought into the Extension office. 4-Her's will not be made active until their 4-H Enrollment fee has been received.
- Report your volunteer hours here: http://ext.wsu.edu/Volunteers/logon.aspx. Your username is your email and your password is "password!" without the quotation marks. This is a requirement for all WSU Volunteers!
- Any youth planning on bringing a Market Steer to the Klickitat County Fair need to prepare for the upcoming March 25th Beef Pre-Show from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm at the Klickitat County Fairgrounds. 4-H Youth bringing a steer for weigh in and tagging must accompany their animal, bring a filled out pre show form, and be currently enrolled in 4-H. If you purchased your steer out of the state of Washington bring a brand inspection from that state. If your steer was purchased in state Helen Rolfe can do them at the pre show.

- Over 300 people in our state became sick after their contact with live poultry in the past six years—many were young children. Many people raising backyard flocks may not be aware that all poultry, even birds that appear clean and healthy can carry *Salmonella* bacteria. The bacteria can contaminate a bird's body and anything near the area where they are housed, such as cages or coops. People who come into contact with contamination can then get *Salmonella* illness. - Want to talk about Biosecurity? New learning modules (called Learning Objects) have been designed for adults and 4-H/FFA youth in grades 6-12 and are in need of piloting groups to try them out. If your club is interested contact Abby at abbyb@klickitatcounty.org to receive simple instructions and a copy of the lessons. Youth do not have to be enrolled in 4-H or FFA to use these materials; everyone is welcome. The modules focus on cattle (dairy and beef), sheep, goats, and pigs, but the principles are applicable to all animal species. There is no maximum or minimum number of reviewers or piloters per site. Links to the first two Learning Objects are included along with the corresponding online evaluations for everyone to complete after they have gone through the modules.
