





pesticides, or making poor choices when selecting and applying pesticides can be devastating to honey bees and other pollinators. The 4-H'ers are

encouraged to learn about bee-killing pesticides being used in their

communities – by homeowners, businesses, or farmers. Then, they should investigate how the impact of those pesticides on honey bees can be lessened.

Prizes for the top three national winners, provided by the Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees, are \$750, \$500, and \$250. Each state winner will receive an appropriate book about honey bees, beekeeping, or honey. In 2012 Washington State 4-Her Marina Graham of Enumclaw won 3rd Prize in the
