- What do you call an intact male cat? An intact female? A baby? (A Tom, a Queen, a kitten)
- 2. What ages mark kitten, adult cat and senior? (Kittens: up to 8 months; Adults: over 8 months, under 10 years; Senior: over 10 years)
- 3. What does CFA stand for? (Cat Fancier's Association)
- Where were cats first domesticated? (Egypt)

Anatomy, Care, Health:

- 5. What is polydactylism? (Having more than the usual number of toes)
- 6. How many toes and claws does a cat have, front and rear? (5 toes in front, 4 toes in back)
- 7. Why do cats scratch things like furniture or trees? (To sharpen their claws, to mark territory or to exercise)
- 8. How many bones does a cat have? (230)
- What is another name for whiskers? (Vibrissae)
- 10. How long is a cat's gestation? (61 to 63 days)
- 11. How old are kittens when they are weaned?

 (They start weaning at 4-5 weeks and should be fully weaned by 8 weeks)
- 12. How many teeth does a cat have? (30 teeth)
- 13. Are cats herbivores, omnivores, or carnivores? What does this mean? (Carnivores they are primarily meat-eaters)

Breeds, Colors:

- 14. What is a purebred cat?

 (An animal whose ancestors are all from the same recognized breed)
- 15. How many breeds does the Cat Fancier's Association currently recognize? (41 according to the 4-H material, 42 according to the CFA website; accept either answer)
- 16. What are the two types of coats? What do you need to groom each? (Longhaired and shorthaired) For a longhaired you need a bristle brush and a metal comb for mats. For a shorthaired you need a soft brush and a cloth. For both you need nail clippers)
- 17. Name two breeds each of long-haired and short-haired cat.
- Long Haired: Balinese, Himalayan, Maine Coon Cat, Norwegian Forest Cat, Persian, Ragdoll
- Short Haired: Abyssinian, American Shorthair, American Wirehair, Burmese, Cornish Rex, Devon Rex, Egyptian Mau, Havana Brown, Korat, Manx, Ocicat, Russian Blue Siamese, Tonkinese, Turkish Angora (or Angora)
- <u>Note:</u> These lists answers reflect fairly common breeds of cat, but do not include all breeds recognized by CFA
- 18. Name one breed of cat with either no tail or a very short tail. Manx, American Bobtail, Japanese Bobtail
- 19. Name one cat coat color or pattern
- Colors: black, blue, gray, chocolate, brown, sable, fawn, cream, white, red, orange, beige, lilac, tan
- Patterns: solid, tabby, tipped, bi-color, tuxedo, calico, tortoiseshell, parti-color, pointed


- 20. What are standard cat vaccines? (Distemper-Rhino (FVCRP), Rabies, Feline Leukemia)
- 21. Name one external and one internal parasite of cats.

External: Ear mites, Ticks, Fleas, Cat lice

Internal: Tapeworm, Heartworm, Ringworm, Coccidiosis, Toxoplasmosis


22. What causes hairballs? Is this a serious health problem? How are they prevented? Cats swallow loose hair when they groom themselves. Sometimes the hair lodges in the stomach and forms hairballs. Usually these pass or are vomited, but they can partially block the digestive tract. Surgery is rarely necessary. Prevention can include regular brushing and adding a bit of food oil to the cat's diet.


At the judge's table, _____

Pose the cat in a sitting or standing position facing the judge. Show your cat's conformation in this order: head shape (long face or round face), body type (long body or cobby body), tail (or lack of tail), and coat texture.

Keeping cat with its side toward the judge, run your hand against the lay of the coat and then back down the body to smooth it down.

Equipment.

The harness should be unable to slip off, but not tight enough to cause discomfort to the cat. It should also be clean. Use a small light leash.

Questions____

When you are done presenting your cat, return it to a comfortable position and remain standing before the judge. Answer any questions from the judge as well as you can. The judge may make a further examination at this time.

When the judge dismisses you, pick up your cat in the safety carry and return to the judging cage or the benching area, whichever one the judge indicates. Stay in the benching area until your competition class is done, since you may be called back before the judge. The judge may also have you exchange cats with another participant.
