4-H/FFA Educational Display Rubric for 2018

Always have the following on the back of your poster in the upper right hand corner:

Your Name, Age Division *(4-H Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, Senior, FFA), Club and Class/Lot on a 3" X 5" size on the upper right hand side of the back of the poster when you enter it on Monday before fair at the Bennett Pavilion from 3-7pm.

*Cloverbuds 5 to 7 years old; Juniors 8 to 10 years old; Intermediates 11 to 13 years old; Seniors 14 to 18 years old; FFA 9th to 12th grade

Always have the following on the front of your poster:

- ✓ Title of your poster
- ✓ All work done in ink, marker or computer printed, no pencil
- ✓ Poster/display should be easy on the eye, colored neatly and support your topic.
- ✓ Use all of the display area; do not leave a lot of blank space.
- ✓ All contents of the poster need to fit the size of the background. Overlapping materials or hanging parts do not stay attached and can be torn from the display. Try using scrapbooking tape tabs, double stick tape or lamination.
- ✓ The poster should show your creativity and originality. Printed pictures and copied text from another source and used as your own is called plagiarism (remember to reference) and is illegal. Text should be in your own words. If you do use another source, credit must be given to the source.
- ✓ Work should be completed by the student only. Parent input is limited to suggestions only.
- ✓ Wording and pictures should to be large enough to be seen from a distance of 6 feet.
- ✓ Give ample enough time to create/make your poster. Make sure you use glue that sticks well to the poster board. Do not try and complete a poster the night before it is due, it is more likely to have mistakes and have parts come off of it.
- ✓ Always remember that your poster will be seen by many viewers as they visit the Fair. Take pride in your work and create your best exhibit.
- ✓ A poster/display cannot exceed the following dimensions: 2' deep X 3' wide X 6' high. If poster/display does not fit the dimensions, it's an automatic disqualification.
