While this is not an event hosted by the 4-H Youth Development Program, it could be an opportunity for fun community service outreach! The Festival of Colors is looking for volunteers to aid in free, fun family outdoor activities. We need people to assist in manning stations for different kite related activities. Some ideas we have, but are not limited to are:

- Running of the Bols-We attach a big windsock called a bol to the backs of the participants and see who is the first to make it to the end of the field.
- Winder card races-Participants get timed to see who can wind a dual line set back on to a winder card.
- How long would it take you to build this kite-We will provide a kite for the participants to build, they are timed, the quickest time wins
- Hoop winder toss-Much like horse shoes but we use empty plastic hoop winders.

ANIMAL MGMNT & OWNERSHIP DEADLINES - Goat, Swine, Sheep, Dog, Cat & Dairy Heifer Replacement More information is available at (http://extension.wsu.edu/4h/) under section 9, "Animal Management and Ownership." Section 9.6 States: Animals must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for the following periods of time prior to the official county exhibit activity, including junior livestock shows (dates listed in parenthesis are approximate and vary based on annual county exhibit dates):

Breeding Beef - 90 days (May 1st in GH) (May 9th in 2017))

Equine - 90 days (May 1st in GH) (May 9th in 2017))

Llama - 90 days (May 1st in GH) (May 9th in 2017))

Dairy - 90 days (May 1st in GH) (May 9th in 2017))

Dairy Heifer Replacement - 60 days (June 1st in GH (June 9th in 2017))

Goat - 60 days (June 1st in GH (June 9th in 2017))

Sheep and Swine (Breeding and Market) - 60 days (June 1st in GH (June 9th in 2017))

Cats - 60 days (June 1st in GH (June 9th in 2017))

Dogs - 60 days (June 1st in GH (June 9th in 2017))

Cavies - 45 days (June 15th in GH (June 24th in 2017))

Rabbits and Poultry - 45 days (June 15th in GH (June 24th in 2017))

Animals raised by the 4-H member from birth or hatching are exempt from the minimum time periods.

PRE-ORDER 2017 NATIONAL YOUTH SCIENCE DAY KITS – Incredible Wearables

The 2017 National Youth Science Day engineering challenge, *Incredible Wearables*, is now available for pre-sale! Developed by University of Nebraska-Lincoln, *Incredible Wearables* is a hands-on project that challenges young people to use the engineering design process to build a wearable fitness tracking device that will help people lead healthier lifestyles. The 75 to 90-minute project is highly adaptable and is suitable for 4th-12th graders. The \$1 pre-order discount is reflected in the \$23.95 price point and kits will be available for pre-order at this price until mid-July. CITIZEN SCIENCE POLLINATOR PROJECT – June 6th

Eli Bloom, a PhD candidate in the Department of Entomology at WSU has been helping with a research project to study wild bees in the Puget Sound region on small-scale diversified farms for the past 3 years.

Recently he has been working with growers in a citizen science program to monitor bees and

pollination on their farms. He is mainly interested in working with gardeners and growers of small fruits and vegetables, ranging from monocultures, to those that produce many different crops in a polyculture type system. He is interested in how that diversification of crops impacts bee communities and pollination.

This spring Eli has been emailing growers throughout western Washington to enlist their help in this project, and somewhat surprisingly, there has been a substantial response. Some of these responses came from Grays Harbor County. He is hosting a training session where he can teach these growers how to monitor bees, and report these data.

If you farm or garden small fruits and vegetables and would like to participate in a citizen science program to monitor bees and pollination, please read the information below.

An hour-long training with Eli Bloom is scheduled for Tuesday, June 6th, from 5:30-6:30 p.m. at the WSU Extension office in Elma (32 Elma-McCleary Road/County Fairgrounds).

4-H RITE OF PASSAGE TRAINING / PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITY

Do you ever get that feeling you are ready for change but you don't seem to be able to start? Maybe the compass is present but the map isn't, or the spirit is welling but the flesh is weak? A Rite of Passage is an opportunity for personal empowerment; it is a ceremony that marks the initiation into a new stage in your life. The work is closely aligned to what in neuro-psychology is described as "establishing and integrating autobiographical experience with intentional personal narrative." Three days of wilderness self-reflection in a safe container of intention and empowerment might be just what you need!

The 4-H Rite of Passage has been offering facilitated self-reflection opportunities for teens and training for adult participants for over ten years. This year's adult and teen fasts will be run concurrently, July 12 -20 in Colockum, WA.
