Our 4-H School Gardens in Burundi, Africa need a reliable water source! For our 2016 Global Giving year-end campaign, we are raising \$2,500 to purchase, install and maintain 4 water catchment systems for our 4-H Sister School gardens.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has generously donated \$500,000 in matching funds to support the first day of the year-end campaign on #GivingTuesday. **All donations received on #GivingTuesday (Nov. 29**th) will be matched at 50% until the first \$1 million is raised! In addition to this huge matching opportunity, all new recurring donations made from #GivingTuesday through December 31st will be matched at 200% up to \$100, after the fourth monthly donation. The campaign begins on Tuesday, November 29th at 12:01 am EST (or 9 pm Monday night for Pacific time zone).

Burundi is one of the 3 poorest countries in the world and is working to heal from trauma and poverty caused by decades of civil war. More than 70% of families live on less than \$2 a day, and 46% of the population is under the age of 15. Children go to school hungry and spend the day in the classrooms with no electricity, running water, or nourishment. During the first 18 months of this program, Burundi 4-H has:

- Trained over 50 Burundian educators in the school gardens curriculum and 4-H positive youth development
- Formed community garden management committees which have begun to provide support to the 4-H school gardens
- > Taken steps to improve the quality of the soil after the first year's gardens
- Shared produce harvested from the first year's gardens with youth, families, and community members during a summer celebration
- Begun preparations for the second year of school gardens
