OUTBOUND 4-H EXCHANGE PROGRAM TO TANZANIA . Application Due February 1

Maryland 4-H is offering a Summer Outbound program to Tanzania this year. The application deadline is February 1 and program dates, including one night in Washington DC prior to departure, are July 22. August 3. Students age 15-19 can apply. The costs include the \$3250 Program Fee plus 1 night lodging/meals in Washington DC, and roundtrip domestic flights from the delegates home airport to Washington-Dulles International Airport. WASHINGTON STATE 4-H SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES - Apply January 1st . March 15th You will find that all 4-H scholarships have been consolidated for 2018 at http://extension.wsu.edu/4h/youth/scholarship-opportunities/ and there will be one 4-H scholarship application through 4HOnline.

The application opens January 1st, and is due March 15th at 9:59pm. Washington State 4-H is pleased to offer a number of different scholarships. Current and former Washington State 4-H members are eligible to apply. Applicants must have accumulated at least two years of 4-H affiliation. Previous Washington State 4-H scholarship recipients are not eligible to apply. Applicants must be a senior attending an accredited two or four-year college or university in the fall.

Please encourage mature teens with advanced leadership skills to apply to attend future National 4-H Conferences.

National 4-H Conference is the pinnacle experience in 4-H Citizenship, providing the opportunity for young people to connect, learn, engage, lead and impact their communities, their nation and their world.

National 4-H Conference delegates engage in personal development experiences that increase their knowledge, resources, and skills while they discuss topics affecting youth and 4-H programming nationwide. The delegates choose an important societal topic and in round table groups prepare a briefing. During the conference, the groups present their briefing to federal officials around the Washington, D.C. area. Delegates not only learn while at the conference: they are empowered to create positive social change in their communities and have the opportunity to practice and apply their skills in a real-world setting.
