## **How State Fair Points Are Done**

## **Showmanship:**

- **A.** Pre fair: Blue ribbon results of showmanship classes at the Pre-Fair Show in June may be substituted for the Grays Harbor Fair showmanship class under the following circumstances:
  - a. Only if the same horse is shown at both.
  - b. That horse shown must have been in the exhibitor's management by March 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year.
- **B.** Must compete in Showmanship at Grays Harbor Fair regardless if shown at Pre Fair.
- C. A blue in showmanship and a blue in equitation/driving/dressage/gaming event are considered first based on points earned.
- D. A blue in showmanship and a red in equitation/driving/dressage/gaming event are considered second based on points earned.
- E. A red in showmanship and a blue in equitation/driving/dressage/gaming event are considered third based on points earned.
- F. Ties in sections C thru E will be decided by judging scores.
- G. Showmanship points will be calculated similar to a performance class using their point system.

## **Class/event:**

- A. Performance Classes- the best 4 classes added together with the most points
  - a. Stockseat Equitation
  - b. Huntseat Equitation
  - c. Saddle Seat Equitation
  - d. Bareback Equitation (Western and/or English)
  - e. Trail
  - f. Rail Class for Seniors only
- **B.** Driving
  - a. Pleasure
  - b. Reinsmanship
  - c. Precision
- C. Dressage
  - a. Dressage Equitation
  - b. Dressage Class
- D. Gaming classes-the best 4 classes added together with the most points
  - a. Poles
  - b. Figure 8
  - c. Key race
  - d. Two barrel flags
  - e. International flag
  - f. Barrels

State Fair Qualifying Points: points are scored by the placing received by exhibitor at the Grays Harbor Fair.

A red in showmanship and a red in equitation/driving/dressage/gaming event does **not** qualify for State. White ribbons do not qualify for State. A white in herdsmanship as a club does **not** qualify anyone from that club for State. Other criteria as determined by the 4-H Horse Council will be used to establish the order of eligibility.
