The Kindle Fire is a great, reasonably priced tablet if your main objective is "media consumption." If you are planning to use your device for reading, watching videos, and listening to audiobooks and music, the Kindle Fire could make your entertainment more portable and streamlined. You can also set up your Kindle to view your email and Facebook accounts, and there are other apps and games you can add to make it a more robust device.
