ALL TACK AND ATTIRE WILL FOLLOW THE REQUIREMENTS LISTED IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST HORSE CONTEST GUIDE AND OR SUPPLEMENTAL MANUALS.

Tack and attire will be checked prior to showmanship, dressage, English, and Western classes for safety and proper equipment.

- *Dressage riders must provide a caller if they want one for their classes, we will not provide one, unless someone volunteers.
- *Classes may be moved around to accommodate time constraints.
- *4-H members must participate in showmanship. Late arrivals will not be allowed to show if they miss showmanship.
- *The Danish System will be used. Ribbons will be awarded to all participants based on their own merit.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: 4-H PACIFIC NORTHWEST CONTEST GUIDE takes precedence over all other manuals. The guidelines and rules within this publication are the guidelines and rules that Stevens County 4-H equine events will follow. USEF rules will prevail over the use of 4-H manuals for Dressage events.(http://4h.wsu.edu/projects/documents/2012PNWHorseGuide_finalapproved.pdf)

It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to know the rules of this show. Please refer to the Pacific Northwest Contest Guide, for 4-H rules and regulations. (A copy will be available the day of the show for viewing. You must refer to this manual for the correct tack and attire to wear at this show. There will be a tack and attire check prior to the show and riding classes. Exhibitors not in compliance may be disqualified from a class or need to change to appropriate tack and attire. Please come prepared.

You must 8 years of age by Oct 1st 2017 to participate in the show in this show.

Junior: 8-10 yrs Intermediate: 11-13 yr Senior: 14-18 Open youth will ride in correct age divisions Open: 19 & over. Walk trot: all ages—(novice riders) may not cross enter into performance classes, may ride western games in correct age division at their own pace.

Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry of any exhibitor who has shown an objectionable attitude toward a given show or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a show or to its management. Show management reserves the right to combine, cancel or split classes accepts entries for unfilled classes at regular fee, and to substitute or vary officials listed in the program list. Exhibitors will be advised if any changes are to be made. The judge has the option and is encouraged to ask for any reasonable additional work to aid in the placement of any class. The judges' decision is final! No person may enter the space set aside for the judge without permission of the ring steward. All entries must be in writing by the owner or agent. Parent or guardian must sign all entries of exhibitors under the age of 18 years old.

- ** NO RUNNING HORSES ON THE GROUNDS
- **NO RIDING DOUBLE
- ** ALL DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH
- ** HELMETS REQUIRED WHEN ON HORSE BACK BY ANYONE 18 YEARS AND UNDER (riding boots are required)

In classes where horses compete collectively, the gates will be closed **2 minutes** after the first horse has entered the ring. No horse is allowed to enter the ring once the gate is closed. Gate holds must be cleared with the management prior to the class.

Exhibitors must appear in the ring suitably attired with the correct number, clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Entries with incorrect number or no number will be disqualified.

Stallions Not Allowed Unless, under 1 year of age and may be shown by Senior 4-H members and adults in accordance with 4-H policies. All stallions will maintain their space in the arena.

WSU Stevens County Extension, Northeast Washington Fairgrounds, members of the show committee and its' associates will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury, by fire or otherwise, that may occur to any horse, or for any article of any kind that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify the above organization against all claims and demands, of any kind or nature that may grow out of injury occasioned by any horse or exhibited my them or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any action from such horse. All horses will be entirely at the owner's risk.

<u>AWARDS</u>. All Classes will be judged by the Danish system with all exhibitors rated with blue, red, or white rating in the show records for the class. Blue, red, and white ribbons will be given out to each participant in each class on individual point placings. Any additional awards will be given based on funding and sponsorships for each show. YEAR END BELT BUCKLE: 4-H members who attend all three horse shows and have the highest points in their divisions will be eligible for a belt buckle.

*All entries must be received by date listed on show entries to avoid post entry fees.

DRESSAGE ENTRIES must be received by pre entry date on entry forms to set ride time for pattern test

Refunds will be given only upon receipt of a veterinary certificate stating the nature of the disability and presented prior to the horses' first class. Refunds will be by check in the mail

**Youth who show under 4-H must have a horse certificate on file on or before MAY 1ST to be eligible for Belt buckle. Youth who wish to qualify for state must have completed all the requirements listed in the Stevens County Horse Policy prior to the August 4th show. The August 4th show is an 4-H open horse show, but will also serve as the qualifying event for eligible youth.
