**Updates:** WSU Mason Extension CED launched the first series of IT & Big Data information sessions in Mason County. using public data to tell stories, data mining and more.

# **Noxious Weed Program**

Mason County Noxious Weed Control Board staff were on the ground, and in the water, for much of September, treating knotweed infestations on 36 parcels within the county. Supplemental funding from the Washington State Department of Agriculture's knotweed

program supported the targeted efforts in Finch, Sherwood and Coulter Creeks and in the North Bay area. This "Boots on the Ground" approach to noxious weed control resulted in multiple detections of new invaders including Policeman's helmet, a "Class B designate". This escaped ornamental is considered extremely invasive to moist, natural areas and was located in Sherwood Creek. Plant locations were inventoried and, in most cases, manually removed.

In addition, as part of the Participating Agreement between Mason County and the Olympic National Forest, personnel completed monitoring requirements on nearly 25 acres of program treated federal lands.

# Water Resources Program

**Mission:** The Water Resources program helps members of our community make the best choices

in caring for our local waters by providing research-based tools and information. We connect people with appropriate resources through collaboration with other extension

programs, government agencies, businesses, schools, and other organizations.

**Updates:** In September, the Water Resources Program continued implementation of the Hood

Canal Pollution Identification and Correction Outreach and Education program. The outreach team completed doorknocking at approximately 500 properties in Tahuya, Hoodsport, and Union. At doorknocking, property owners were invited to participate in a site visit with a water quality advisor. During a site visit, the clean water advisor discussed best management practices including septic system operation and maintenance, pet waste practices, mud and runoff management, and shoreline buffers and native plants. Twenty-two site visits were completed during the summer field

season. Work on this project will continue through the end of 2016.

Significant current partnerships include: Mason Conservation District, Mason County Public Health, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and Puget Sound Partnership.

# **Small Farms Program**
