Community-Supported Agriculture (CSA) is an alternative, locally-based socio-economic model of agriculture and food distribution. CSA members or subscribers pay at the onset of the growing season for a share of the anticipated harvest. Once harvesting begins, they receive weekly shares of vegetables and fruit, herbs, cut flowers, honey, bread, dairy products and meat as well.

This farming method is beneficial to the farmer as they are able to budget farm operation costs, seed money, and labor expenditures up front. CSA's are beneficial to you, the customer, too! It gives you access to the freshest farm products available and you can reap the added benefit of Knowing exactly how your food ended up on your plate!
