Washington State University Extension Kitsap 4-H Camp Management

Rules are made not to restrict people from having fun but to assure that everyone can have fun and be safe, too. The warnings are being stated to make you aware of the risks involved in being out of doors and at camp. The following rules are **to be read to your child** before attending Kitsap 4-H Camp **and then signed** by both guardian and camper.

- 1. Campers are expected to remain on the Panhandle 4-H Campgrounds.
- 2. Campers are to follow all Kitsap 4-H Youth Camp rules and 4-H rules.
- 3. Boys are not allowed in girl's tents/cabins and girls are not allowed in boy's tents/cabins at any time with exception of siblings sharing a tent.
- 4. Campers must use the buddy system when leaving their group during activities or their tent during "lights out". This is for the protection of the camper.
- 5. Campers are not allowed to have matches or lighters. Fire is a very real hazard at camp.
- 6. Campers are not allowed to have knives, fire arms, or weapons of any kind.
- 7. Campers will be sent home if found with cigarettes, alcohol, chewing tobacco, illegal substances including marijuana, or fireworks.
- 8. Campers will not deface any camp property.
- 9. Campers will not use profanity.
- 10. Fighting will not be allowed.
- 11. If a camper brings valuables it will be at their own risk, as the camp is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Please leave them at home. There is no need for money.
- 12. There is a phone available for parents to contact their children in case of emergency. The camp director will supply parents with the phone number after registration. No cell-phones are permitted during camp sessions for campers or counselors. If a phone is brought to camp, the phone will be forfeited to the Camp Director until camper/counselor leaves for home.
- 13. It is the responsibility of every camper's parent/guardian to provide for the campers' own accident and health coverage beyond the limits of the camp coverage.
- 14. Parents, friends or other visitors may visit, but arrangements must be made prior to visiting with the Camp Director. Visitors are welcome during dinner time and evening activity.
- 16. If a camper's behavior is deemed unacceptable, the parents/guardians will be called and asked to pick up their child. No refund will be given.
