The water discussion course, Our Watershed: Pacific Northwest, was created to facilitate this process.



The self-directed water course, Our Watershed: Pacific Northwest, was designed to:

Provide basic knowledge about our water and watersheds

• Raise awareness about water issues confronting watersheds and the communities within them

Provide a structure to learn more about our specific watersheds and actions an individual can take

The course was developed in a "study circle" format. A study circle is a small group of people who agree to meet to discuss an issue in depth. One of the participants facilitates the discussion for the session. The role rotates each week with a different group member facilitating the session.
