WSU 4-H/FFA Show Pig Sales For 2011

Washington State University is sponsoring two feeder pig sales for 4-H and FFA members this year. Approximately 200 pigs will be available from the WSU Swine Center for each sale.

Moses Lake sale The April sale will be held at the Grant Co. Fairgrounds in Moses Lake, WA on April 9, 2011 at 11:00 am. Payment/order forms need to be mailed by April 1, 2011.

Pullman sale The Pullman sale will be at the WSU Cattle Feeding Laboratory on April 30, 2011 at 10:00 am. Payment/order forms need to be mailed by April 22, 2011.

Both spring sales events will begin with an educational program about health, management, selection, and feeding project pigs. All youth and adults are encouraged to attend even if they are not purchasing animals.

Terms of sale Prices are reflective of the current market. Pigs will be sold for \$100. Only checks/ money orders made out to "WSU Controller" will be accepted. No cash sales. Individual checks/ money orders will need to be written for each youth or family. Only one order form is necessary per family, however, each and every youth getting a pig must be listed by name on the order form.

Group order forms are not accept-

able. Payment and order form must be post marked by the specified date for each sale. No phone orders. You are not guaranteed a pig until your order form and payment are received. Completed orders [form and payment] will be done on a first come basis. If order form and payment are received after all pigs have been reserved, you will be notified and your payment will be returned promptly. Once payment and order form are received by WSU there will be NO REFUNDS. Pigs purchased but not claimed will be sold in the name of the purchasing youth the day of the event.

For the sales at the WSU Swine Center, we ask that you respect our biosecurity measures. We reserve the right to refuse sales to anyone entering the premises with a dirty/contaminated truck or trailer. Please be sure that all manure is removed. For animal care issues, we also reserve the right to refuse sales to anyone without adequate hauling devices. Think about the welfare of the pig and make accommodations for weather.




