


Lambing School

your participation. We appreciate your compliance with this requirement. For more information, contact your local 4-



Be SAFE: Safe, Affirming & Fair Environments Curriculum

You may be interested in another "hotoff-the-press" Extension publication, *Be SAFE: Safe, Affirming and Fair Environments*, available from Michigan State University. This curriculum is designed to help young people, aged 11-14, and adults work in partnership to create environments that are physically and emotionally safe. While the primary audiences for Be SAFE are young people and adults involved in out-of-school time settings (such as after-school programs, 4-H, Boys and Girls Clubs, Scouts, Y's, sports programs and faithbased programs), it also applies to mid-

dle school settings. Be SAFE focuses on education and prevention of bullying, bias, harassment, and other hurtful behaviors – as well as providing suggestions for intervening when young people are affected by these issues. It draws from extensive research from a variety of key disciplines – as well as from evidence-based bullying prevention programs. The Be SAFE curriculum can be ordered at the MSU Extension Bookstore. Shooting Sports Scholarship from Daisy

Daisy, in conjunction with National 4-H Shooting Sports, offers scholarships of \$500 which will be awarded at the National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational, June 23-28, 2013 in Grand Island Nebraska. In 2012, Daisy awarded two \$500 scholarships. The qualifications for scholarship consideration include:

- 1. Minimum of a 3.0 GPA from your high school
- 2. Three years participation in 4-H shooting sports
- 3. Recommendation of High School counselor or principal
- 4. Recommendation of 4-H coach or equivalent who is not a relative
- 5. Scholarship would be payable to any two-year or four-year accredited Jr. College, College or University

Applicant required to submit personal Resume

7. Application would require a 250 - 500 word essay about "How participa-

tion in the 4-H Shooting Sports better prepared them for college and for life."

8. Certified copy of high school transcript.

Scholarship money would

be available in the second semester of the freshman year and can be used for books, housing, and or college fees.
