Why Record Books?

Youth can gain a lot of valuable knowledge and skills in 4-H, especially through 4-H clubs and long-term projects. But kids are usually so busy having fun, they don't always recognize the life skills or other competencies they learn while participating. Record-keeping can help 4-H'ers, as well as their parents and adult leaders, realize more of the value of their involvement in clubs, camps, projects, and other educational activities.

But, unfortunately, completing a 4-H record book often has become a mundane, outdated chore or something youth do at the last minute as a requirement to take part in competitive events. Despite this, there are many positive reasons for integrating record-keeping into 4-H projects throughout the year. Keeping a 4-H record book aims to help youth:

- Learn how to organize themselves;
- Learn how to set reasonable goals for themselves;
- Appreciate what they've learned each year from the goals they reached:
- Recognize what they learned in their 4-H projects;
- Explain what they've learned;
- Keep track of costs of their projects;
- Gather information needed to apply for awards and scholarships;
- Complete applications and resumes for jobs and college;
- And yes, also meet requirements to participate in some county, state, or national 4-H events.

4-H License Plates Available




The new 4-H license plate is now available throughout Washington State.

Warnick (R-Moses Lake) paved the way for the 4-H clover license plate which was signed into law in 2012. Plates can be purchased for \$40 and \$30 for renewal, in addition to the cost of standard license plates. "The specialized 4-H license plates

are a great way for current 4-H families as well as alumni and supporters to increase awareness about the 4-H program as they drive across town or across the state," said Pat BoyEs, Director, 4-H Youth Development, Washington State University Extension. 

ChildObesity180 Launches "Healthy Kids Hub"



ChildObesity180 has launched a new website, www.healthykidshub.org, to provide out-of-school-time organizations with hundreds of resources, toolkits, and products to help them promote healthy habits. The Healthy Kids Hub contains products collected from universities, non-profits, and other organizations to help OST providers adopt healthy principles in three main areas: Drink Right, Move More, and Snack Smart. These principles encourage children to drink water instead of sugary beverages, snack on healthy items such as fruits and vegetables, and boost their movement and physical activity.

Tens of millions of kids regularly take part in out-of-school-time programs, which include activities such as scouting program, sports leagues, and other activities. These programs have been identified as a promising area for childhood obesity intervention efforts — but because there are so many different programs, it's tough to cre-

ate uniformity across the board. In 2011, *ChildObesity180* worked alongside an eclectic mix of organizations to create the three-pronged approach, including the Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of the USA, the National 4-H Council, National Council of La Raza, the National Council of Youth Sports, the National Urban League, Pop Warner, US Youth Soccer, and YMCA of the USA.

The hub is the next part of that effort. Along with including a wide range of searchable educational resources for out-of-school organizations, it also includes rotating coupons and special offers to help programs implement the principles without breaking the bank.

In the coming months, organizers also hope to add a social networking platform to facilitate idea-sharing between organizations and a grants management platform to help organizations secure funding to support implementation of the principles.
