2013 Goat Schooling Show

Our 2013 4-H/FFA goat schooling show and clinic was a huge success this year. Our judge, Patty Gylling from Cle Elum was wonderful. She taught each of the kids something new whether they were brand new to showing or had shown for many years. Our clinic included a grooming and shearing demonstration. Patty talked about how to get all kinds of goats ready for fair, whether pygmy goats, dair



useful information for the kids to learn. During the showmanship clinic, each of the kids got to spend 1:1 time with the judge improving their skills. Showmanship classes were then held according to 4-H age groups and the kids got to immediately put to use the information that they had just learned in the clinic. At the conclusion of the show, the judge talked to the participants and interested parents about the utility goat project. These classes currently are not offered at Chelan Co or NCW fair, but we are hoping to have them added in 2014. A sample obstacle course was set up and the kids practiced taking their goats over the "A" frame, teeter totter and jumps. Some goats took right to it, others weren't as confident, but it gave the kids some ideas of other things they could do with their goats.

Are you the one to represent Chelan County Fair?

The search has begun for the 2014 Chelan County Fair Ambassadors. Applications are currently being distributed to all Chelan County High Schools and the County Extension Office. Applications are also available at the Chelan County Fair Office, 5700 Wescott Drive, Cashmere, WA.

The Chelan County Fair Ambassadors will be representing the Fair at numerous speaking engagements and parades throughout the year. This year's theme is "Cream of the Crop"

Applicants must be current high school Juniors, live within the boundaries of a Chelan County School District, and be schooled in Chelan County. Candidates must be single, never been married, and not plan-

ning to marry before October 1, 2014. Each Ambassador will be provided with committee selected apparel, and will be awarded a scholarship in the amount of\$1,000 to help defray the cost of further education. This will be made in two payments, see Official Rules on page two of the application.

The deadline for applications to be postmarked is January 31, 2014. The *Chelan County Fair Ambassadors* will be announced no later than March 1, 2014

Untility Goat Project for 2014

Utility goat is a separate goat project and requires its own record book section, but it can be done with any breed of goat and can be done exclusively, or in addition to another goat project (i.e.: dairy goat and utility goat, or novelty goat and utility goat) The same animal can be used for both projects, but not required. If a member desires to do the utility goat project and enter the classes at the fair, they MUST BE ENROLLED in the GBGE utility goat project at the beginning of



the year. Utility goat project is made up of 2 sub projects. The first sub project is pack goat. The second part is driving goat. We will be focusing on the pack goat category this year and the obstacle

course classes which are part of pack goat. We are not planning any driving goat classes this year unless someone tells me

that they are interested in that for this year. We will phase it in later if there is interest. I am planning monthly obstacle course practices starting in the spring time at either my home (Rock I sland) or Michelle Reeves home (East Wenatchee). These practices will be open to ALL 4H members who are enrolled in the pack goat project and wish to practice with us. We will also be planning at least one pack goat trail experience which will also be open to ALL 4H members enrolled in the GBGE project. I will put memos out as to the practice dates and the trail experience date. Lastly, we will be having our annual goat schooling show again this year in June (date yet to be announced). We will be having utility goat obstacle course classes as part of that show in addition to our usual fitting and showing clinic/show. I do not have a judge secured for this show yet, but when I do, I will put an announcement out regarding the date of the show.




Putting the Child First

Help us start 4-H in Burundi! Building Solutions!

Need a unique gift for the holidays? Help us start 4-H in Burundi! Building Solutions! Burundi located in the heart of Africa and the size of the state of Maryland, is one of the five poorest countries in the world (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Burundi). Over 70% of families live on less than \$2 a day. Kids, just like our 4-Hers, go to school hungry and spend the day in classrooms with no running water or electricity, and little or no books or supplies. 100 years ago Washington 4-H built neighborhoods of support for young people from Ritzville to

Raymond. Today we are doing that same solution-building work in Burundi. How can we work with Burundi youth and volunteers to be solution builders? In January 2013, Kevin Wright and Mary Katherine Deen traveled to Burundi and worked with a local non-profit organization that is currently sponsoring 9 afterschool programs with 50 - 100 youth ages 6 - 12 in each program. We took soccer balls that were generously donated by 4-H groups to the schools. The youth were thrilled.

We are looking for 4-H groups in Washington who want to partner with us to continue working with Burundi schools and communities to build solutions. How do we begin such a large and seemingly overwhelming task? In consultation with the Burundian staff we have developed our plan for being *solution* builders: Bring Burundian staff to Washington State in summer 2014 to share the Burundi story with us and to learn about WA 4-H; Conduct a summer camp for Burundian youth and a professional development education for Burundian staff in Burundi Summer of 2015; Develop 4-H school gardens in the 9 schools to assist in feeding the children as well as teaching livelihood and life skills to youth and families.

How can YOU be a *solution builder*? Find Burundi on a map. Help others find Burundi on a map. Read about Burundi; Invite us to share the story of 4-H in Burundi at an event in your county or area. Do you have a county, regional or state event coming up? Need a speaker? Ask us to be that speaker and share the story; Engage 4-H youth in international awareness and action; Invest in the 4-H in Burundi program through the Washington State 4-H Foundation: donate an amount for a gift. *As little as \$5 makes a difference and \$100 can help change a life forever.* \$10 will provide one

day of 4-H day camp for a Burundian youth (includes meals); \$25 will send an indestructible soccer ball to a 4-H partner school in Burundi; \$50 will provide one week of 4-H day camp for a Burundian youth (includes meals); \$75 will provide support for one day of immersion education for Burundian program staff.; \$100 will provide one week of

Professional Development for Burundian 4-H staff.
