15, 14, 13-no more than minor faults in any of the major items of conformation. Basically Excellent

correct in structure, outstanding in muscular development, has optimum outside fat.

12, 11, 10-no more than moderate faults in muscular and skeletal structure. Muscular de-Good velopment is not outstanding, but is average to good. Skeletal structure is basically sound.

9, 8, 7-has moderate to severe faults in some items of skeletal and muscular structure. Fair

Muscular development is usually average to inferior.

Poor 6, 5, 4-may have serious structural defects and may be definitely lacking in muscling.

3, 2, 1-extremely lightly muscled animals. Extremely Inferior
