

Trees for Central Northwest Washington

Hot, dry summers and cold and drying winters in North Central Washington present challenging conditions for many trees we know and want to plant.

There are beautiful trees that grow well in areas of Chelan and Douglas Counties. In addition to familiar trees commonly planted in this area, a host of others less frequently seen add interesting form, flower and colors to enrich the diversity of our tree population. Consider these trees, whether you're planting a new landscape or replacing a tree.

Trees grown here in Central Northwest Washington require supplemental water-- more during the first year of growth.

Comments: Tolerant of many conditions

Small Flowering Trees

Japanese Stewartia- Stewartia pseudocamellia

Size: 20'-30' tall x 20'-30' wide

Zone: 5

Shape: Pyramidal to oval

Foliage: Green Foliage: 2.5" white

Fall color: Yellow/red/purple

Comments: Attractive exfoliating bark, avoid hot afternoon

Japanese Ivory Silk Lilac- Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk'

Size: 25' x 15' Zone: 4

Shape: Oval, compact with upward curving branches

Foliage: Dark green

Flower: Large white clusters in early July

Comments: Excellent choice for urban landscape

Chinese Fringe Tree- Chionanthus retusus

Size: 20' x 20' Zone: 5

Shape: Broadly oval Foliage: Deep green

Flower: White, snow-like, in large clusters in late spring

Fall color: Bright yellow

Forest Pansy Redbud-Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy'

Size: 20' x 25' Zone: 5/6

Shape: Upright spreading/rounded

Foliage: Deep purple to bronze-green interior Flower: Magenta rose in spring (shown)

Fall color: Yellow

Comments: 'Hearts of Gold' is zone 5

 $Sourwood - Oxydendrum\ arboreum$

Size: 20' - 25' x 10' - 15'

Zone: 5

Shape: Pyramidal, drooping branches

Foliage: Green

Flower: Fragrant, lily-of the valley like

Foliage in summer Fall color: Red - purple

Comments: Prefers soils of 7.2 or less. Slow growing.

Amur Maple - Acer ginnala 'Flame'

Size: 20' tall x 20' wide

Shape: Low branched, rounded

Foliage: Green Flower: NA

Fall color: Orange-red

Comment: Red November nice cultivar

Paperbark Maple - Acer griseum

Size: 25' - 30' x 20'

Zone: 5

Shape: Upright, spreading Foliage: Dark green

Flower: NA

Fall color: Unreliable red

Comment: Beautiful exfoliating bark

Golden Desert Ash- Fraxinus excelsior 'Aureafolia'

Size: 20' x 18' Zone: 5

Shape: Rounded, compact

Foliage: Yellow Flower: NA

Fall color: Golden-yellow Comments: Good street tree

Persian Parrotia - Parrotia persica

Size: 25' - 30' x 20'

Zone: 5

Shape: Upright to wide spreading, oval

Foliage: Pink/purple emerging leaves turning green

Flower: NA

Fall color: succession of yellow - orange - red Comments: Good landscape and street trees

Wireless Zelkova-Zelkova serrata 'Schmidtlow'

Size: 24' x 36' Zone: 5

Shape: Broadly spreading vase

Foliage: Medium green

Flower: NA Fall color: Red

Comment: Other cultivars with different shapes, heights

Medium Trees- mature height 30'- 55'

Medium Size Conifer Trees

White Fir- *Abies Concolor* Size: 50' - 75' tall x 25' wide

Zone: 3

Shape: Pyramidal Foliage: Blue needles Flower: Cones Fall color: NA

Comments: cultivar 'Candicans'

Eastern Red Cedar-Juniperus virginiana

Size: 40'tall x 10' wide

Zone 2

Shape: Pyramidal

Foliage: Blue/green scale or awl-like needles

Flower: Seed cones (berry)

Fall color: Bronze

Comments: Tolerant of adverse conditions.

Many smaller cultivars 15 - 25 ft.

Japanese crytomeria- Crytomeria japonica

Size: 50' - 60' x 25'

Zone: 5

Shape: Pyramidal

Foliage: Green blue, awl

Shaped needles Flower: Cone Fall color: Bronze

Comments: Smaller popular cultivars

'Yoshino' (15'-25' x 10'-15')-

Colorado Blue Spruce-Picea pungens 'Hoopsii'

Size: 30' - 60' x 10' - 20'

Zone: 3

Shape: Pyramidal

Foliage: Blue/green needle

Flower: Cone Fall color: NA

Comments: Smaller cultivar - Fat Albert (15')

Cedar of Lebanon- Cerus libani 'Stencoma'

Size: 40' - 50' x 30' - 50'

Zone: 5

Shape: Pyramidal in youth; dense; flat topped, horizontally

spreading branches with age

Foliage: Very dark green, needles in clusters

Flower: Cones, purple Fall color: NA

Comments: Slow growing

Medium Size Deciduous Trees

Autumn Blaze Maple- Acer x freemanii 'Jeffersred'

Size: 50' tall x 40' wide Zone: 3

Shape: Broadly oval Foliage: Green Flower: NA (seedless) Fall color: Brilliant orange/red Comments: Fast growing.

There are many cultivars of maple trees

Black Tupelo-*Nyssa sylvatica*Size: 40' x 25'

Shape: Pyramidal to irregular rounded

Foliage: Glossy green

Flower: NA Fall color: Red

Comments: Does not tolerate high pH (above 7.8)

Ginkgo biloba

Size: 40' - 50' x 25' Zone: 3

Shape: Pyramidal, irregular Foliage: Green fan-shaped

Flower: NA Fall color: Yellow

Comments: Buy male clones . Slow-medium growth rate. Autumn Gold, Lakeview, Magyar, Princeton Sentry,

Shangri-la

Katsura- *Cercidiphyllum japonicum* Size: 40' x 40' Zone: 5

Shape: Upright, pyramidal when young, rounded with age

Foliage: blue green Flower: NA

Fall color: yellow to apricot

Comments: Thin bark can sunburn. Protect young bark in

winter.

Compacted soil can be a problem.

Kentucky Coffee Tree- Gymnocladus diocus

Size: 50' x 35' Zone: 4

Shape: Narrow to oval Foliage: Dark green

Flower: White pea-like in late spring, pods Fall color:

Yellow

Comments: tolerates heat, drought, alkaline soils, and soil

compaction.

Golden Rain Tree- Koelreuteria paniculata

Size: 35' x 30' Zone: 5

Shape: Rounded Foliage: Dark green

Flower: Yellow in summer, pods Fall color: Yellow/orange

Comments: Tolerates drought, heat, wind, and air pollution

Large Trees- mature height 60' and over

Large Deciduous Trees

Tulip Tree- Liriodendron tulipifera

Size 60' x 30' Zone: 5 Shape: Oval Foliage: Green

Flower: Greenish yellow with orange center; late spring,

early summer Fall color: Yellow

Comments: Fast growing. Smaller cultivars

Fastigiatum (50' x 15')

Large Conifer Trees

Dawn Redwood- Metasequoia glyptostroboides

Size: 70' x 25' Zone: 4

Shape: Pyramidal, rounding with age

Foliage: Soft green needles

Flowers: Cones Fall color: Bronze Comments: Deciduous

Giant Sequoia- Sequoiadendrum sempervirans

Size: 60' - 70' x 30'

Zone: 5

Shape: Pyramidal Foliage: Blue green awl

Shaped needles Flowers: Cone Fall color: NA

Comments: Reddish brown bark

Weeping Alaskan Cedar- Chamaecyparis nootkatensis

Size: 60' - 90' x 20' - 30'

Zone: 4

Shape: Pyramidal with weeping tertiary branches

Foliage: Green scale-like needles

Flower: Cone Fall color: NA
