

LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM FUNDING GUIDELINES

The ADVANCE at WSU Leadership Program is an initiative for supporting leadership opportunities for women in the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine (STEMM) disciplines and diverse male and female faculty, with diversity defined in terms of under-represented minority (URM) status, in any discipline at WSU. **The aim of the program is to foster career development of women and URM faculty by supporting leadership opportunities and trainings.** The Leadership Program is open to all tenure-track and tenured faculty. For tenured faculty, this initiative is intended to help grantees through the promotion process, encourage more women and URM faculty to seek administrative responsibilities, and enhance leadership succession planning.

The ADVANCE at WSU Leadership Program provides funding for proposals that have identified suitable leadership programs, trainings, and opportunities. Examples of these include the National Center for Faculty Development & Diversity Faculty Success program http://www.facultydiversity.org/, the WSU Center for Transformational Learning & Leadership Tidal Leadership certification http://cahnrs.wsu.edu/tidal/course-dates/, or other leadership programs that require registration fees and other expenses.

The proposed use of funds must demonstrate considerable potential for providing career advancement opportunities for the eligible WSU faculty members and intent to serve/assist in reducing barriers for women in STEMM fields and male and female faculty who self-identify as URM, designated according to the NSF definition, as African Americans, Native Americans and Hispanic Americans. Within one year of completion of grant activities, grant recipients must provide a brief report on their experience with the Leadership Program. The ADVANCE at WSU will also conduct a one-year follow up with the grant recipient.

Eligibility: Any tenure track or tenured faculty woman in one of the following departments may submit a request:

- Integrative Physiology and Neuroscience (formerly known as VCAPP)
- Mathematics (MATH)
- Mechanical and Materials Engineering (MME)
- Physics (PHY) and Astronomy
- Plant Pathology
- Political Science
- Psychology
- School of Biological Sciences (SBS)
- School the Environment (Pullman and Vancouver)
- School of Molecular Biosciences
- Sociology
- Veterinary Microbiology & Pathology

Funding: Typical awards range from \$3,500 to \$5,000, depending on the leadership program and particular opportunity.

Required Deliverables and Expectations: All recipients will be asked to provide a report on their experience with the Leadership Grant program, and will also occasionally be asked to discuss their experiences with program representatives.

Deadline: Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

Proposal Format: To be considered, applicants must submit a completed application, which includes the following information:

- Cover Sheet (use attached form)
- Proposal: The description should not exceed one page (12-point font) and should include:
 - o A description of the leadership program, including dates, times, and locations
 - A rationale for why this leadership program will advance the professional development of the grantee
 - o Any other funds that could be leveraged to support this leadership opportunity

- Budget (use attached form)
- Other: The request must be accompanied by a letter of support from a nominator to include a senior faculty member or department Chair or Director.
