How does violent extremism, political violence, organized crime, and corruption fuel violent conflict and thwart peace-building efforts? Colette Rausch will discuss how fragile states with weak institutions and governance are unable to stem the tide these threats pose to peace.



Colette Rausch is the associate vice president of Global Practice and Innovation at the US Institute of Peace. She has directed or participated in missions and projects in more than two dozen countries including Afghanistan, Iraq, Kosovo, Liberia, Libya, Myanmar (Burma), Nepal, Nicaragua, Yemen, Senegal, and Sri Lanka.
