



This policy outlines the Registries procedures regarding authorship of USTUR reports and publications in peer-reviewed literature.

Criteria for determining senior authorship

The person taking the lead in the design and conduct of the work, collection and analysis of the data, and preparation of the manuscript will be the senior author. Customarily, this is also the originator of the idea for an experiment or study. The senior author (i.e., lead investigator) should be determined at an early stage of the work.

Criteria for determining co-authorship

Co-authors should help design, or participate in the discussions leading to the design of an experiment, and/or assist with the execution of the work and/or the collection and analysis of the data, and write a section of the paper.

Criteria for formal acknowledgment

Formal acknowledgment may be given to individuals who provided technical assistance, performed support tasks such as providing

illustrations, or who suggested or carried out routine analytical procedures or calculations.

Responsibility for establishing co-authors and order of authors

The senior author and co-authors are encouraged to establish the name and order of authors collegially, but, if there is no consensus, the ultimate responsibility for the selection and order of co-authors rests with the senior author who has absolute discretion. No person will be listed as a co-author who has not agreed to be so listed.

Authors assume responsibility for publications

The sole author of a publication, and each person named as a co-author, assumes individual responsibility for the scientific and technical content of the publication.
