Washington State University is committed to providing opportunity for minority business enterprises (MBEs) and women business enterprises (WBEs) to participate as suppliers of goods and services to the University.

To facilitate participation, minority business and women business enterprises are encouraged to be certified by the <u>Washington State Office of Minority and Women's Business Enterprises (OMWBE)</u>. This certification increases contracting opportunities with state and local governments.

The University also encourages certification by the <u>U.S. Small Business Administration</u> for small businesses, women owned businesses, small, disadvantaged businesses, HUBZone businesses, veteranowned businesses, and service-disabled veteran owned businesses.

The <u>Washington Small Business Development Center</u> is dedicated to helping Washington businesses grow and succeed through advising, education, and research.
