Honors Student Thesis Advisor

- Undergraduate Advising
 - I mentor approximately 3-6 undergraduates each year who complete independent projects in partial fulfillment for their honors thesis. The Senior Honors Thesis experience is supervised by a faculty adviser/mentor, with at least one additional committee member to assist students in their creative activities. The thesis has both writing and speaking components. The length and style of the writing component varies by the type of Honors thesis. The speaking component consists of a 15-30 minute formal oral presentation or a poster presentation at a university-sponsored event or professional conference before the student's committee and responses by the student to questions from the committee.

 - Work closely with our career services to bring in employers and influential business leaders to our Managing a Career in Science (BMS610) course.
 - Examples: Every fall we bring in 4-6 leaders in industry to a forum in Managing a Career in Science, BMS610. At an additional date we bring in 4-6 employers from the area for a similar forum.
- I spend an additional 7-12 hours per week mentoring and advising individual graduate students.
