Dr. Micah Hester is Chair of the Department of Medical Humanities and Bioethics and Professor of Medical Humanities and Pediatrics at UAMS. He provides clinical ethics consultations at both UAMS and Arkansas Children’s Hospital and helps with the research ethics consult. He also serves on numerous committees both locally and nationally, and produces scholarly research in bioethical/philosophical areas. Dr. Hester has published nine books and numerous journal articles. His most recent book as an editor and chapter author is the second edition of *Guidance for Ethics Committees* (Cambridge University Press 2022). Trained in philosophy with a focus on American pragmatism, Dr. Hester received his doctorate from Vanderbilt University. Professionally, he has worked on the Board of Directors of the American Society for Bioethics and Humanities as well as the Association of Bioethics Program Directors.

Dr. Aulisio is the Susan E. Watson Professor and Chair of the Department of Bioethics at Case Western Reserve University and Director of the Center for Biomedical Ethics of the MetroHealth System. He has authored numerous articles and book chapters on clinical bioethics, ethics consultation, organ donation and transplant, double effect and related areas and is a sought after speaker nationally and internationally. In 2009, Dr. Aulisio was honored with the American Society for Bioethics and Humanities’ (ASBH) Distinguished Service Award. Dr. Aulisio also has extensive international bioethics experience. His most recent international collaboration is as one of two CWRU faculty participants in the 11 university multinational effort of The Darwin Centre Trust’s Darwin International Institute for the Study of Compassion (2016-present).
