Biography of Artist

Dr. Jeremy Crawford is currently Associate Professor of Tuba and Euphonium at the University of Alabama, where he is also the Assistant Director of Administrative Affairs for the School of Music. In addition to maintaining a regional, national, and international performance career, Dr. Crawford is a passionate advocate of new music for the tuba. He has commissioned several tuba-euphonium ensemble pieces and tuba solos. His prominent premieres include Amir Zaheri's *to Bring to Bloom* and *Five Muses* by John Stevens. Dr. Crawford has released three solo recordings: *To Bring to Bloom* (2018), *Hummingbird* (2019), and *All Made of Tunes* (2020). He earned a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Iowa, a Master of Music degree from Northwestern University, and the Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Alabama. His former teachers include John Manning, Rex Martin, and Demondrae Thurmon.
