ulation quickly grows into a bigger problem.

Failing to report Leave Without Pay to our Payroll/Personnel team in Facilities Services by the deadlines each pay period has a similar negative consequence. A handful of late reports to our Payroll group in Facilities puts pressure on us to drop everything and get them sent in to Payroll Services. We try to send them up as quickly as possible in hopes that they are recorded in the correct pay period. Unfortunately, our handful of late reports often meets up with late reports from departments across campus so that Payroll Services is quickly buried under the pile of late reports and scrambling to get them all entered before the final cut off. When we aren't able to make the cut off, the employee's next pay period is impacted – often creating misunderstanding and more work.

Please help Facilities Services reduce the pile-up of late LWOP reporting in Payroll Services. Employees can help by reporting LWOP to your Supervisor as soon as you know you will be taking it. Supervisors can help by getting that LWOP reported to our Payroll/Personnel team as soon as you are notified by the employee.


## Safety glasses: All in favor say "Eye!"
