

Dr. Jean Dodson Peterson is a tenured Associate Professor of Viticulture at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo in the Department of Wine and Viticulture and the Department of Plant Science. In this role, she teaches a wide array of viticulture, research, and thesis courses for undergraduate and graduate students. She has earned her Certification in Effective College Instruction from the Association of College and University Educators and the American Council on Education. She has been awarded the Panhellenic Award for Excellence in Education and is twice a recipient of the Terrance Harris Award for Excellence in Mentorship. She maintains an active research program dedicated to advancing our understanding of grapevine physiology, rootstock-scion interactions, rootstock selection and vine performance factors. She recently co-authored a book entitled, *Grape Rootstocks and Related Species*. Dodson Peterson joined the Cal Poly faculty in 2014 and has since served as Curriculum Chair, Academic Scheduler, Academic Senator, Vineyard Redevelopment Coordinator and Faculty Vineyard Liaison. She has also enjoyed dedicating time to campus-wide initiatives aimed at improving campus climate and diversity through her grantsmanship, committee work and recently as the University Faculty Fellow for the College Based Fee proposal. Prior to joining the faculty at Cal Poly, Dodson Peterson was at the University of California, Davis, where she earned her undergraduate degree in Viticulture and Enology with a minor in Managerial Economics and ultimately her M.S. and Ph.D. in Horticulture and Agronomy.
