

CAHNRS Diversity, Equity, and Inclusive Excellence Mini Grants 2022-20223

The CAHNRS Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee seeks proposals for its second year of DEI Mini Grants for activities that address Theme 4, Institutional Diversity, Integrity, Openness, and Accountability of the CAHNRS strategic plan. The goal of these grants is to fund projects that:

- Create and sustain a college community that is diverse, inclusive, and equitable
- Uphold a culture of integrity, excellence, and accountability in pursuit of CAHNRS's goals and economic viability

CAHNRS DEI Committee in collaboration with the Office of Student Success and Academic Programs are now accepting grant proposals that address these goal themes. Three awards of \$2,500 each will be granted to those proposals that best meet the following criteria:

- Application of the CAHNRS strategic theme to promote DEI at all levels of the college
- Demonstrate positive impact of the proposed activity on CAHNRS and the WSU community
- Involve engagement to broaden the impact of the proposed project beyond WSU
- Prioritize using funds in ways that directly benefit local communities
- Proposals focusing on long term impacts to the CAHNRS, or WSU learning community will be given preference

Faculty, staff, and students in CAHNRS are encouraged to submit proposals. Proposals must include a one-page (12-point font, 1-inch border on all sides) detailed description of the plan and how it will contribute to DEI, budget, timeline of activities and expected outcomes.

The budget must include all expenses including, but not limited to, speaker fees, travel expenses, student (support) assistants, purchase of materials and advertising. **Proposals lacking a detailed budget will not be considered.**

- 1) Grantees must submit a one-page report on the grant outcomes to Madeline McPhee by June 30, 2023
- 2) Proposals will be **accepted through October 15**, and should be submitted to Madeline McPhee at cahnrs.dei@wsu.edu
