What is ROP?

A vital question of any culture is how youth are prepared to take on the identity of a mature individual, and what significance that role will have.

The Rite of Passage program provides emerging adults with a positive life narrative to begin their journey into adulthood.

The 4-H Rite of Passage provides reflection and solo-time in the wilderness. We prepare initiates for as much as a 3-day fast alone without shelter or company in the natural world.

The vision fast process for participants involves 3 phases:

- severance from the world that they know and will leave behind,
- · threshold or time alone, and
- Incorporation into their new life and life status as an adult.

The benefits of this work at the individual and cultural levels are many and include: self-knowledge (both strengths and weaknesses), leadership skills, self-esteem, self-confidence, sense of responsibility for self and community, fuller access to emotions, feelings and spirit, respect for self and others and a deep honoring of the natural world that supports us all.
