

# **4-H International Exchange Program:**Local Coordinator Position Description

## **Purpose:**

Seeking one or two individuals in each county or region to assist WSU 4-H International Exchange Program Coordinator with the International Exchange Program and act as local volunteer or staff coordinator(s).

Time commitment: varies between the three modes of the program (See Brochure or website for more details)

- **Summer Inbound Program:** February to September 1 each year. Approximately 5-10 hours per month. See duties listed below.
- **Outbound Program:** Recruiting local youth to participate in outbound exchanges and prepare them to submit applications by early November.
- Yearlong High School Program: Monthly communication with the delegate and the host family during the school year.

## **List of Duties:**

- Actively recruit and be a local advocate for youth and families to encourage youth and family participation in 4-H International Exchange Programs.
- Act as a contact person and resource for local host families and liaison with State 4-H International Exchange Coordinator.
- Provide local leadership and communication to participants, county and state personnel
- Assist in screening process and in-home interviews for prospective host families
- Maintain communication with host families during hosting period

Local coordinators are supported by the State 4-H International Exchange Program Coordinator and county personnel.

### **Qualifications:**

- Ability to listen, follow guidelines and protocols
- Ability to promote and recruit for the program
- Able to make sound unbiased judgements
- Maintain flexible mindset and inspire others
- · Conduct oneself in a professional and confidential manner
- Availability in case of emergency during hosting period
- Ability to participate in international exchange program orientation as requested by State International Program Coordinator

### **Benefits:**

Local Coordinators are able to further develop skills related to global learning and enhance their cultural experiences. Assisting in the 4-H International Exchange program is a great way to engage with people, have new experiences and through encounters with others, learn about oneself.
