- Key Points about Influenza A Viruses around Swine this document was sent to the Fairboard from the Washington State Fair Association. It's a good reminder about best practices for swine/human health. The most important thing to remember is if you are sick during Fair (or at home) stay away from your pigs! - Practice what we preach! During Fair make sure you are setting the example for the public by always washing your hands after working with your animals and not eating in the animal barns.

- Poultry Owners! All poultry exhibited at the Fair must be purchased from a NPIP certified heard or be tested for Avian Influenza and P-T before Fair. <u>If you purchased your bird from a feed store keep the receipt and bring it with you to Fair Check-In as proof.</u>
- The <u>Washington State 4-H Fair</u> runs from August 31st to September 23rd and is jam packed with events and contests for our 4-H members. If your entry or animal qualifies to go to the State Fair consider attending! View the State Fair <u>Exhibitor Guide</u> to see all of the options available and sign up on Sunday of Fair from 1-3 pm in the 4-H Room.
- Make sure you're checking in with your Club Leader about club decorations etc.!
- Just a quick reminder: Weight requirements for Market Sale Livestock are: Beef 1100 lbs. & up Swine 240 - 300 lbs. Sheep 115 – 150 lbs. Goats 75 – 115 lbs. Poultry (varies by species): Chickens 4 – 7 lbs. Ducks 2 – 7 lbs. Geese 5 – 12 lbs. Turkeys (Heritage) 8 – 15 lbs.. Turkeys (Broad Breasted) 12 – 25 lbs. Rabbits 3 – 8 lbs.
