WHAT IS A SUPER POSTER?

- GRABS YOUR ATTENTION
- CONSIDER ADDING A BORDER
- HAVE CONSISTENT STYLING
- INCLUDE ESSENTIAL INFORMATION ONLY
- PAY ATTENTION TO DETAIL



- Grabs Your Attention. Visuals should be interesting, colorful, and creative. Their appearance should draw you to read them not make it difficult to read.
- Consider adding a Border. A border will "lift" your visual off a drab wall. Borders can be actual lines or open margins. Your poster should have at least a one inch border on all sides.
- Have Consistent Lettering. Select a lettering style that is easy to read (must be able to read at least 10 feet away).
- Height should be consistent within a word (unless for a special effect).
- Include Essential Information. Keep basic information direct and to the point. A reader should be able to get all the information as they walk past.
- Pay Attention to Detail. Check and double check spelling. Erase any pencil lines you've used as guides. Keep your poster clean and neat.
- Uses the 4-H Name and Emblem Correctly (4-H, not 4H, or 4h). Include the 18 USC 707 if possible.


NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR LEADER OF THE YEAR!
