In September, WSDA published an emergency rule that prevents movement of any domestic or feral domestic rabbits, rabbit products or equipment from Lopez, Orcas or San Juan Islands. The rule was updated on Nov 8 2019, to include Whidbey Island and will expire in 120 days. Learn more

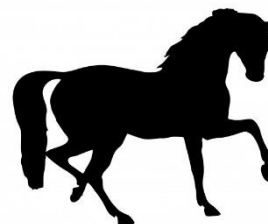

Hosted by Goldendale Community Library & Klickitat County 4-H

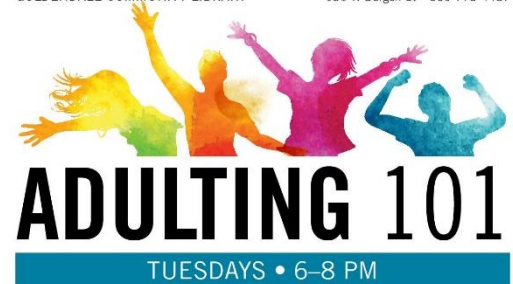
