Education



PRESCHOOL STORY TIME

Goal: To teach children about the fascinating Salish Sea as well as their role in caring for it.

Status: Volunteers go to Sno-Isle libraries and lead a one hour story time with activities for preschoolers and their families. In 2019 the program included visits to eight different libraries in June, July and August. That number is up from five libraries in 2018.

Participate: New volunteers for this program are recruited by the team leader in January and February.

BOOTHS/FESTIVALS

Goal: To share BW volunteer knowledge at festivals, fairs and events throughout the year.

Status: In 2019 BW attended the Everett Farmers Market, Evergreen Fair, Festival of the River, Mukilteo Lighthouse Festival, Sustainamania, Tour de Terrace & Vibrant Living Fair at Northshore Senior Center.

CLASSROOM PRESENTATIONS FOR YOUTH

Goal: Increase Puget Sound literacy and appreciation in elementary school children including taking them on field trips to the beach. *Status:* Will begin reaching out to educators in March to schedule 2020 presentations and field trips. *Join Us:* Volunteers are recruited and trained in February and March.

CRABBER EDUCATION

Goal: Volunteers educate recreational crabbers about basic conservation rules and how to keep their crab pots from getting lost. *Status:* In 2019, we handed out Conservation Kits on Opening Day of Crabbing Season at Kayak Point, Everett 10th Street Pier, Mukilteo Lighthouse Beach & Edmonds Pier. Volunteers also worked at the Festival of the River, the Evergreen Fair and Everett Farmers Markets. *Join Us:* Volunteers are recruited in May and training is held in mid-June.

PET WASTE EDUCATION - PET SHELTERS

Goal: To educate dog owners about the impact of their pet's waste on our regions water quality.

Status: This new program is looking to expand throughout the County in 2019. Volunteers supply Doggie Bags/Scoop Kits to shelters and talk to dog owners at shelter Open Houses, dog park events and Farmers' Markets *Join Us:* As this program expands the team leader will reach out to volunteers via the Newsletter and email.

PET WASTE EDUCATION - VET CLINICS

Goal: To educate dog owners about the impact of their pet's waste on our regions water quality.

Status: We supply Doggie Bags/Scoop Kits to six vet clinics to hand out to their patients. Volunteers collate the kits, deliver them to their Vets quarterly. *Join Us:* New volunteers are recruited by the team leader in January and February.



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STEWARDSHIP



BEACH CLEAN-UP

Goal: Volunteers perform beach clean-ups monthly at Howarth Park, Picnic Point & Mission Beaches.

Status: In 2019, 63 volunteers collected over 800 pounds of trash during nine beach cleanups. Beach Clean-ups will continue through the winter with visits alternately between Howarth and picnic Point Parks. *Participate:* Upcoming Beach Clean-Ups are publicized in our newsletter and via email.

RESEARCH & CITIZEN SCIENCE

BEACH PROGRAM

Goal: To monitor salt water quality at local beaches and keep beachgoers healthy.

Status: Volunteers collect water quality samples at Jetty Island and five South Snohomish County beaches—Howarth Park, Mukilteo Lighthouse, Picnic Point, Brackett's Landing, & Marina Beach. The samples are then delivered to the lab in the Snohomish Delta on the same day. *Join Us:* Training is typically in May for those who want to participate.

INTERTIDAL MONITORING

Goal: To provide land managers with data to assess changes over time and create a State of the Park annual report. Status: Volunteers collect baseline biological data at several public beaches each summer to develop an understanding of how the sites can change over time. Field days are on weekdays during low-tides. It is a great opportunity to hone your identification skills and get experience using equipment. Join Us: Upcoming monitoring projects are publicized in our newsletter and via email.

MISSION BAY WATER TESTING

Goal: To provide water quality monitoring at Mission Beach in Tulalip.

Status: Water quality monitoring occurred every Tuesday from May to August. *Join Us:* Upcoming testing is publicized in our newsletter and via email. All new trainees and most veteran volunteers attended a practical field trip with some choosing to attend an optional short visit to the lab.

WRACK SURVEY - HOWARTH PARK BEACH

Goal: Study changes to the vegetation in the area that was restored by the Department of Ecology at Howarth Park Beach. *Status:* Researchers from the University of Washington, State of Washington, and Snohomish County collected beach wrack data before the Howarth Park beach restoration and are now collecting the post-project data. With the data we can collect, the researchers will have a much better data set and their resulting conclusions will be much stronger. *Join Us:* Upcoming studies are publicized in our newsletter and via email. Typically need a minimum of 4 volunteers and a maximum of 20
