



Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program Scholarship Guidelines

- Application packets will be available on the Snohomish County Extension Website, the Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program Website, and at the monthly Horse Program meeting.
- Three Scholarships will be awarded annually. The top scoring applicant will receive \$2,000 and the next two high scoring applicants will receive \$1,500 each.
- Scholarship may be applied for by any Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program members who are *either* in their last year of the 4-H Program *or* applying/accepted into their first or second year of post-secondary education.
- No one individual may receive a scholarship more than one time.
- All applicants must have been a member of the Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program for a minimum of three years (current year counts toward requirement) and must be a member during the time that they are applying for a scholarship.
- All applicants must include their Permanent 4-H Record (completed to the current date - current year may be in pencil) as part of their application. The Permanent Record is used only as a source of information, not part of the scoring process, and will be returned after the interview.
- All applicants must plan to attend an institution that is accredited by recognized accreditation agencies.
- All funds will be paid directly to the college/university for tuition, room, board and/ or books.
- Only complete application packets will be considered.
- All application packets will be scored first by the Selection Committee.
- Top Ten after the written evaluation must be available for an interview prior to completion of the selection process.
- Application materials become the property of the Snohomish County 4-H Horse Program and will not be returned (except for the Permanent Record).
