


THE 4-H ADVANTAGE:

SNOHOMISH COUNTY 4-H

Annual Average Enrollments (2019 on)

More than 850 active youth

More than 330 active adults with more than 3,000 combined years of 4-H experience

50 clubs and 30 projects including (but not limited to):

- Animal Sciences
- Veterinary Science
- STEM
- Robotics
- Computer Science
- Engineering
- Visual and Performing Arts
- Archery and Riflery

ELIGIBILITY & COST

- Open to all youth ages 5-18
- A member must be 5 years old by October 1 of the program year
 Program Year: October 1 September 30
- \$30 fee per youth to help cover program management and overhead
- Clubs may also have dues, but are encouraged to engage in fundraising activities to assist with this charge
- Scholarship provided by the Snohomish County 4-H Council are available if the enrollment fee is a hardship for any families
- Group activities may or may not have a fee, depending on the activity
