State Legislature allocated \$3.6 million dollars for grants to assist small and midsize meat and poultry processors in WA.

The grants are to expand the capacity of small and midsize farmers, and ranchers who sell their farm-raised meat products directly to individual consumers, stores, food hubs, restaurants, and schools, in order to improve access to local meat products for the people of Washington State. This public need became apparent during the COVID-19 pandemic, when food supply chains were disrupted, and the importance of resilient local food economies became evident.

GRANTS still available for Thurston County farmers who have experienced an increase in expenses, a decrease in revenue, or had to change the way they do business since COVID began.

Thurston Strong Agricultural Grant assistance for farms, value-added processors, co-ops, and Farmers Markets impacted by the COVID pandemic is still available. If you have experienced an increase in operating costs, have lost revenue, or had to make changes to meet demand or new safely measures in the last two years, you can qualify for a grant of up to \$10,000. There is dedicated funding for those of you who are BIPOC producers.
