

Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA) is offering Local Food System Infrastructure Grants to support local food supply chains and market access for farms, ranches, and food businesses. The intention is to fund projects that expand and strengthen collaboration across linkages in the regional food supply chain.

This includes planning, equipment, and facilities that support on-farm post-harvest handling, aggregation, processing, manufacturing, storing, distribution, and sale of Washington grown, caught, and raised foods.

Did you know that certified organic acreage in Washington has more than tripled from 45,000 acres in 1995 to 149,343 acres in 2021? Did you know that Washington is second only to California in both sales volume and diversity of organic crop production? Washington is an organic powerhouse, but there is so much more potential to grow the sector and realize the environmental, health and social benefits that organic and regenerative agriculture can deliver. The Coalition for Organic and Regenerative Agriculture, or CORA, was formed in 2022 with just that in mind!

Prairie Protection Lead Job Opening with Washington

Department of Fish & Wildlife

WDFW is hiring a "Prairie Protection Lead" who will focus on assisting WDFW and partners with the land acquisition and easement and process to benefit South Sound SGCN and the partnership in meeting shared objectives.

The roles of this individual will include:

- Shepherd priority project opportunities through WDFW processes to select conservation lands for acquisition
- Coordinate with partners to develop habitat protection opportunities in South Puget Sound prairie habitats
- Develop and deliver habitat protection grant applications
- Internal cross-program coordination

The position is slated as full-time for 18 months but may be extended if successful.
