Southwest Washington Food Hub Sales Manager Job Opportunity

The Southwest Washington Food Hub is hiring a Sales Manager! This is a dream job for someone interested in helping build a resilient local agriculture scene!

The Food Hub, a farmer-owned Co-op, runs two produce box programs and sells to local school districts and other wholesale customers. They are trying to find someone to spearhead their sales department, who has experience with CSA programs, sales, and local agriculture.

This job is 20 hours a week and pays \$2,400-\$2,900 per month.

AgWest Farm Credit Grant Opportunity

This grant opportunity from AgWest Farm Credit celebrates the ingenuity and passion of new producers and can help their dreams come to fruition. This program was developed for those who have a vision for their operation but lack the funds to put their plans into action. Successful applicants will receive a one-time \$15,000 grant to support their operation's growth.

Eligibility requirements:

- Be a full or part-time agriculturalist who has two years or less φ operational experience or has plans to start their operation within two years of the grant application date.
- Have an operation located within AgWest Farm Credit's territory.
- Not be a current AgWest lending customer.
- Must be 18 years of age.
- Be a U.S. citizen or a foreign national lawfully admitted for permanent residency or pursuant to certain visas.

Thurston County Cattlewomen Scholarship Opportunity

The Thurston County Cattlewomen are pleased to offer a \$500 Scholarship for 2024.

We ask that applicants meet the following criteria:

- Be an active member of a Thurston County 4-H or FFA organization in the Beef project area, or in a Jr. Breed association.
- Be a current senior in a Thurston County high school enrolling in, or currently attending a 2 or 4 year college or technical school OR have involvement in an Agriculture related field

As the 2024 Thurston County Beef Scholarship recipient, you will receive:

- A \$500 scholarship towards your college education paid directly to the college you are attending upon receiving a copy of the student's registration receipt.
- If the scholarship is not redeemed by winter quarter/semester of award year, it will be relinquished to the second placing applicant.

Applications must be postmarked by May 15, 2024 for the 2023-2024 school year. Recipients will be announced at the May Cattlewomen's meeting

This includes planning, equipment, and facilities that support on-farm post-harvest handling, aggregation, processing, manufacturing, storing, distribution, and sale of Washington grown, caught, and raised foods.
