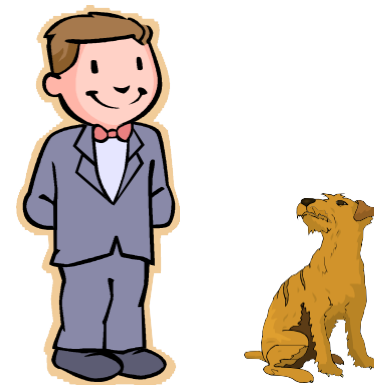

- To show and handle dogs safely
- To work with other 4-H members

- To be courteous to the public, judges, show and fair officials, and other competitors
- To care for and manage a dog

Develop

- Leadership, initiative, sportsmanship and responsibility.
- Self-reliance and patience by working with your dog daily.
- Public speaking skills by expressing your ideas before groups in demonstrations, judging contests, and other activities.
