  - Walk-in: \$15 Individual-\$25 Family **CHOICES WILL BE LIMITED**
    - Walk-ins should be there no later than 8:30 AM to be registered and ready for 9:00 workshop.
    - Those not registered in time will not be able to attend the first workshop.
    - Bringing a Registration Form that is complete except for the workshop choices and having your walk-in payment ready will speed up the process.
- 5 All workshops are filled on a first come/first served basis.

  - Registering early will help ensure your spot in limited space workshops.
