
DEPARTMENT 500-600: 4-H FAMILY LIVING

TOP OF CLASS—SWEEPSTAKES AWARDS – The best blue ribbon entry in each class will be awarded the Top of Class ribbon. A sweepstakes ribbon will be given for the best overall entry in each division. Awards are given at the judges' discretion. Trophies/Awards are given to Blue Ribbon exhibits only. 4-H lid labels that meet the required information will be available.

BREAD BAKING AWARD – A special award will be given to the top Blue Ribbon in Bread Baking Basics-Yeast Breads.

BEST OVERALL FOODS EXHIBIT - Trophies or Special Awards will be awarded for Best Overall Foods Project exhibit in each age group. To be eligible for award, participants must have entered at least two entries in the project exhibits with all receiving blues.

WHEAT AWARD - The Best Baking Demonstrations in the Special Activities Section. A Rosette and a cookbook will be given. To qualify, the entry must be prepared using wheat or wheat flour. The Washington Association of Wheat Growers sponsors this award.

BEST DECORATED CAKE – A special award will be given for the best in each age level.

TOP FOODS OF THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST – Class 504, in each age group will receive aprons from Marlene Garrison.

FUN WITH WOOL – The purpose of this contest is to encourage learning techniques for working with wool fiber. Garments made from loomed, knitted, crocheted or felted fabrics with a minimum of 60 percent wool fiber are eligible for competition. A 3" x 5" card with a sample of fabric attached and listing fiber content and directions for garment care must be pinned to garment. No premium points will be awarded. Special Awards will be given to the best garment in each age group. Refer to 4-H/ FFA General Rules and Regulations.

Models must complete STYLE REVUE FORM including TWO 2" X 2" fabric listed and any notions (trims, lining, batting). Garments should be cleaned and pressed. All exhibitors must attend at least 1 practice with commentaries due by **March 19th**.

4-H FOOD EXHIBITS

ENTER: WEDNESDAY, APRIL 25, 3:00-8:00 PM BOYD HALL

1. Members must be enrolled in a Foods Project.
2. Maximum of 8 entries in each Project Class member is enrolled.
3. Enter baked goods and cookies on a 6-inch white paper plate, inside a Ziploc bag for convenience of Judges.
4. Maximum of 6 perishable entries per member total.
5. Perishable foods may be entered if transported for entry in an ice chest or cooler with ice.
6. All perishable entries will be entered in furnished contain-ers. Ask 4-H Foods Superintendent for containers.
7. All preserved items must follow accepted up-to-date Pres-ervation Guidelines. Check with Extension Office for Guidelines.
8. Recipes and instructions must be submitted with each entry, written neatly, typed, or photo copied. Modifications to recipes must be noted.
9. Purchased mixes or finished products are not acceptable as an entry.
10. All entries must meet project guidelines.
11. Foods entered in 4-H exhibits may not be entered in Open Class Section of the Fair.
12. Mixes (i.e. Missouri mix) must be in Ziploc bags. Enter 1 cup maximum. One entry using the member prepared mix (drinks excluded) should be made and entered as an exhibit
13. Refer to 4-H Extra Foods to determine the amount of baked goods to enter.

All ENTRIES NOT COMPLYING WILL BE DISQUALIFIED

- Foods to be judged will be served to judges only. Adopted 2007 for public safety.
- Judges have the option of tasting food entries. Adopted 2007 for public safety.
- Food entries will not be distributed to general public after judging handling.
- The Superintendent and aides will dispose of all items.
- Divisions listed as Extra are open to all 4-H Members not enrolled in a Foods Project.

General Instructions: Foods must be canned/processed in accordance with the latest USDA/WSU or Ball Blue Book Instructions. Entries must be preserved in Ball or Ball Collection Elite Jars sealed with Ball Lids and Bands or Ball Collection Elite Lids and Bands, or preserved in Kerr Jars sealed with Kerr Lids and Bands or Ball Collection Elite Lids and Bands. A copy of recipe needs to be turned in with food. All foods must be canned using standard jars or jelly glasses. All jars must be sealed. Jar rings are to be removed. Jams and jellies may be opened at the discretion of the judge.

Each product must be labeled with: Product name, Method of Processing, Processing Time, Date Canned. For pressure canning, please label with pounds of pressure used.

3. All items, sewn, knitted, or crocheted must have a completed Clothing & Textiles Construction Data Worksheet. Quilt entries (Class 545 & 546 small & large quilts) must also complete the Quilt Entrant questionnaire. Items not including these sheets will be disqualified.
4. A maximum of eight entries is permitted in each class.
5. Multiple piece outfits will be displayed together, but each item will be judged separately.
6. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE CLEANED AND FREE OF SMOKE AND PET HAIR.
7. Top of Class Ribbons may be given to the Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions in each class.
8. A Wool Award Trophy will be awarded to the top entry using wool in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions.
9. Best 4-H Clothing Project Trophy will be awarded in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions that have at least 2 blue ribbons entries.
10. Best Coordinated Outfit Trophy will be awarded to the best overall Junior, Intermediate and Senior. Entries must include a two piece outfit that can be worn alone plus two other arti-cles that coordinate with the basic garment. Example: Blouse and pants with vest and jacket or shorts and top with pants and another top or skirt.

The divisions listed as extra are open to any 4-H member not currently enrolled in the expressive arts project. Creativity and a Superintendant Awards may be given. No points for Top of Class, Creativity or Superintendant Awards. Any poster, wall hanging, etc., MUST have a suitable backing, be matted or framed as necessary, and MUST BE READY TO HANG. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. Ordinary poster paper is not heavy enough to use as a hanging. STRING AND TAPE ARE NOT ADEQUATE HANGERS.

- 4-H'ers will be judged on their meal planning abilities, food preparation skills, hostess abilities, time management and knowledge of nutrition. A completed form C-0807 is due at the time of the contest. Participants will be asked to indicate a 1, 2 or 3-hour time limit. One hour is reserved for juniors.
