Local Agricultural Organization Scholarships

- The *Asotin County Wheat Growers* are offering one \$1000 scholarship to a senior student from **either** Asotin or Clarkston High school. Graduates of CHS or AHS who are 1st year college students may also apply.
- The *Asotin County Cattlemen* are offering at least one \$500 scholarship to a senior from **either** Asotin or Clarkston High School. Graduates of CHS or AHS who are 1st year college students may also apply.
- The *Asotin County CattleWomen* are offering at least one \$500 scholarship to a high school senior attending **either** Clarkston or Asotin High School. Graduates of CHS or AHS who are continuing college students may also apply.

Purpose: The local Asotin County agricultural organizations provide these college scholarships to encourage graduating high school seniors and continuing students to pursue a career in an agricultural or family and consumer sciences-related field.

Eligibility: To be considered, a student must be planning to attend a two or four-year college in the fall of 2022; with a major in an area of agriculture or family and consumer sciences (and similar majors that would prepare you for a career in agriculture or family and consumer sciences). Continuing college students who are applying for scholarships must have graduated from Asotin or Clarkston High Schools and remain a college student in good standing.

Letter(s) of Reference: Please include **two** letters of reference **with** this application from teachers, advisors, employers or other individuals who can accurately speak about your character, activities, and potential to succeed in college.

Scholarship Awards: Recipients must provide proof of college registration for the 2022 fall semester before scholarship monies will be awarded.

Basis for selection will be:

1. Required High School G.P.A. – 3.25 for the Wheat Growers Scholarship, 3.00 for the CattleWomen’s Scholarship, and 2.00 for the Cattlemen’s Scholarship (**Please include a copy of your high school transcripts**). **Include college transcripts if attending college.**
2. Application – appearance and completeness.
3. Community service, leadership and participation related to your intended major.
4. Financial need.
