Reading of Mission Statement

Reading or disposition of minutes and correspondence. Minutes passed unanimously.

Announcements & Special Guests:

Keegan Heath went to the American Royal Livestock Judging Event with Kati Brown (unavailable due to a basketball event). Keegan came to send thanks from he and Kati for the Leader's Council support. He reported that is was a great experience as he felt he grew as a competitor as they do things very differently in other states. He competed in numerous categories including steers heifers, lambs steers, and swine. He competed in 10 classes of judging, 6 with reasons.

Other states put a lot in their livestock judging They had the highest quality of animals that Cami Brown had ever seen. He did another round of all of this on-line as well. "It's really fun and will take some time. Might be overwhelmed but it's totally worth it!!" There are lots of great opportunities including \$1000 scholarships. Top teams were offered international scholarships to compete. Blazers ties etc. were the attire.

Mark added that the 22-23 state competition will be held in June at the Grant county fairgrounds in Moses Lake and that there are also great prizes at the state level.

• 4-H Enrollment is open through November 15, 2022 for participation in the 2023 Asotin County Fair. Cloverbuds 5-7 years old, Juniors 8-10 years old, Intermediates 11-13 years old, and Seniors 14 to less than 19

years old. Age is as of Oct 1, 2022. \$35 enrollment fee, scholarships are available. Tomorrow is the cut off date.

- Request for 4-H Enrollment Scholarships and AVISTA funding. Mark mentioned that there are some scholarships available and we have some money from Avista from 2021 and that would be a great expenditure of funds.
- Givepulse. One mentioned that she hasn't gotten anything so Janine will be making sure that everyone is getting the information.
- Asotin County Spooner Family Endowment Grant Application for Clubs. Charlene and Linda Bailey worked for the College of Ag and created an endowment with about 4% of interest annually. One of the things they would like to do is to offer a 'mini-grant' for club projects etc. There is an application that will be sent out. The family wants to be directly involved in the process. They are looking at a deadline of Friday, January 6th.

For families that need it well utilized in Grant County if a family needs some extra support such as feed, price of animal, etc., they provide low interest rates and possible building of credit for youth.

 Blake Foraker, new WSU Meats Specialist was discussed and is also hosting a meats clinic in march.
 - Blake was nominated to be first choice and Nick as second choice. Motion passed unanimously.
 - Large Animal Round Robin- Jan Busboom judged in 2021 & 2022. We usually find a judge that can judge four species and ask someone local to judge horses. They get a small stipend and mileage for their time. Michael Coley was suggested and is local. Colby mentioned that Round Robin is judged very quickly with little time spent with kids and thought in that instance, Michael would be a good choice.
